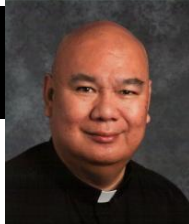
Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ June 3, 2018

First Reading: Exodus 24:3-8
Psalm 116 "I will take the cup of salvation,
and call on the name of the Lord."
Second Reading: Hebrews 9:11-15
Gospel: Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

Sealed in blood and ratified in ritual, a covenant is a tremendously serious promise. In Exodus, the covenant between the Lord and the Chosen People was sealed with the blood of sacrificial animals. In Hebrews, Christ is portrayed as the high priest, offering his own blood as a new covenant for our redemption. Jesus shares his own Body and Blood—the blood of the new covenant which he continues to do today.

A Word from Father Victor ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our belief on the Trinity is one of the greatest proofs of **God's love for us**. We do not reveal ourselves to those we do not love. And we reveal ourselves in proportion to our love. God revealed his very nature, his most intimate life in his loving relationships. And he did this gradually and progressively according to our capacity and need. The essence of the Trinity is a personal relationship of love between the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. Love should also be characteristic of the Christian community. We are rooted and grounded in love. We all have a need to love and be loved. Love is creative, fulfilling and healing. It heals both the one who gives it and the one who receives it.

We all have learned our God in his loving relationship with the Israelites: a father who provides, protects and saves. Despite many infidelities he was a father to all the Israelites. In the gospel of John we read "For God so loved the world that he gave his only son". Whatever we see in the Son is the totality of the Father. The father and the Son are one. IN Jesus we see our God as healer, compassionate, merciful and redeeming. IN Jesus we see our father as "liberator" from the tyranny of sin and the giver of truth and justice. The unity in love of the Father and the Son became the Holy Spirit that empowers, strengthens and encouraged the disciples and God's church to proclaim the good news of our salvation.

It is the same Spirit of love that enables us to experience and enter into that relationship as adopted children of the Father. WE enter into this relationship through the sacraments. How we live our Christian lives allows us to experience God in his unity of three persons.

It sounds like a lot of work. Yes, it is. We have to enter into a personal relationship with him to be able to allow our hearts to have a grasp of a one God in three persons.

It is not enough therefore to go to church or do some apostolate or devotions. It involves our hearts and in our day to day living in relationship with God to encounter him as three persons.

Let that journey in relationship continue and unfold.
