Two weeks after we heard the people acclaim Jesus as prophet, we hear Jesus asking the disciples who they think he is. Of course, he has his own answer ready: he is the one who must suffer, die, and rise from the dead. The first reading, describing "him who they have pierced," prepares us to hear the message Jesus has, that the Messiah must suffer, and we who follow this suffering Messiah must be prepared to suffer as well.

From the Desk of the Pastor....



The theme of today's Gospel is the mystery of God's mercy and forgiveness. In forgiving our sins, God has a big eraser. We cannot sin so as much as God can forgive. We can only sin as a human being, but God can forgive as a God. We sin as a finite creature, but the Lord forgives as the infinite creator. Our nature is prone to sin and we are wounded by our sin. God heals us by His forgiveness and He asks us that we do likewise.

David was a privileged friend of God, but grew callous despising the word of God. Yet, when he repented, prophet Nathan comforted him saying, the Lord, for his part, forgives your sin, you are not to die. The woman known as a sinner repented before Jesus by her act of homage. So, Jesus said to the woman, "Your sins are forgiven." The Pharisees criticized Jesus for doing that. This is because the Pharisees and we quite often attempt to measure God's corn by their own bushel. Where we would take our brother by the throat, God would forgive him seventy times seven. All God requires from the sinner is faith and repentance. God opens the doors of heaven to a repentant sinner no matter how big the sin is. The greatest of sins is to be conscious of no sin.

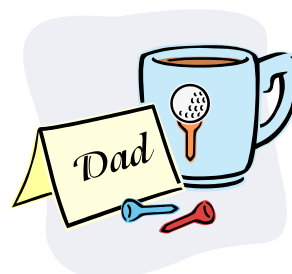

Liberty Lessons

What does "shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion" mean?

This phrase, known as the "Establishment Clause," started out as a prohibition on Congress' either establishing a national religion or interfering with the established religions of the states. It has since been interpreted to forbid state establishments of religion, to forbid governmental preference (at any level) of one religion over another, and to forbid direct government funding of religion. This misinterpretation has caused us to lose our Religious Liberties. It has changed our freedom to practice religion to freedom to worship. As Catholics we are called to go out into the world not just worship behind four walls.

The idea behind the **Rediscover: Summer Share Project** is simple: *provide a quick and easy way to connect the people we know and meet with the resources of Rediscover:* And there is no time like summer to do just that!

Summer is the time of year when we get out and connect with friends, family and neighbors – and even meet new people:

- Up to the lake, graduation parties, reunions, picnics and weddings with friends and family
- Backyard BBQs and impromptu chats with our neighbors
- Travel and meet new people on our trip

Connect people you know and meet to Rediscover: resources

Both Rediscover-faith.org and mobile app offer over 400 short videos and brief articles about God, what it means to be in relationship with Jesus Christ, the Bible – and all about the Catholic Church – what we believe and why, plus more than 150 prayers and even a handy Mass, Confession and Adoration finder. - **Rediscover: Share Card.** This handy card is the size of a standard business card, so it's easy to store in your wallet or purse.
- On one side is the web address Rediscover-faith.org plus a QR code that you can scan with a smartphone and go straight to the home site for Rediscover.

- On the other side of the card is the web address and a QR code to take people to Rediscoverapp.com, where anyone can download the free Rediscover app for iPhone, iPad and Android devices.

2. **Share Features on both the web site and the app - with the push of a button.** Did you know that you can send a link to any article, video or prayer on the web site or app with the push of a button? It's easy to do.

- If you want to send something via social media, just click on the icon of your choice that corresponds to what you want to use to share – Facebook, Twitter, plus a many other options under the SHARE button with the orange and white plus sign icon.
- Or just send a good old-fashioned email with a link to the article you want to share to a friend of family member...just click on the SHARE button and then select email from the dropdown menu.
- It's just as easy to share on the Rediscover: app – just touch button the right top corner of the phone screen and follow the prompts.

Share Rediscover: resources with the touch of a button.
