First Reading Isaiah 45:1,4-6
Psalms 96 "Give the Lord Glory and honor."
Second Reading 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b
Gospel: Matthew 22:15-21

Isaiah speaks of Cyrus in our first reading today. Cyrus was a king of Persia who conquered Babylon and liberated the Jewish people. In this reading, we see that it was the Lord who called Cyrus into action on behalf of the Jews. This reading gives a good preparation for the Gospel story about repaying to Caesar what belongs to Caesar. For in the end, does not everything belong to God.

Dear Brothers and Sisters,
Two weeks have passed since we celebrated the parish festival and the feedback as far as numbers are concerned are encouraging however there is more than what the numbers indicate. More essentially we need to reflect on the participation of our parish members. Parish festivals do somehow indicate a pulse as to the sense of belongingness and concern of the members. So many express their sentiment that we should keep doing a fall festival yet very few want to step in. We need as a community to begin reflecting about this challenge on how we can strengthen our sense of belonging and ownership.

Our God is a benevolent God. He has provided us with all that we need to be able to grow as a community. As in the first reading God promised not only lives filled with plenty and comfort but also joy and goodness. All these is meant to strengthen us so that even in times of distress, like St. Paul in the second reading, there is a heart that is stable, able to live joyfully and peacefully even in humble times. Do our comforts strengthen us or "spoil us"? Do we have inner strength? It is almost impossible to fathom the goodness of the heart of our God. He continues to invite despite the many times he has received cold shoulders. Every person he invites to his banquets he wants to be appropriately disposed for the celebration. To do so, he provides the opportunity. Where can you find a person like our god?

Indeed our God is a God who wants to restore life. He invites us to his kind of life. He never gets tired nor stops to invite. One day, we pray, we will come to realize that true happiness and fulfillment can be found only in his invitations. Let us not get tired as well to always invite one another to come and build God's kingdom in our midst.
