First Reading Wisdom 11:22-12:2 Psalm 145 "I will praise your name for ever, my king and my God."

Second Reading 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2 Gospel: Luke 19:1-10

The first reading is a prayer to the Lord who will "spare all things, because they are yours, O Lord and lover of souls." In the Gospel story of Zacchaeus, Jesus proclaims that "the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." Let us reflect on the ways in which we have been spared and saved by the Lord.

A Note From The Pastor



Jesus told a story that challenges some of our basic religious assumptions. It turns a role model into a villain and a villain into a role model. Jesus introduced them to us as a Pharisee and a tax collector. The Pharisee was a respectful person and loaded with commendable qualities. On the positive side he fasted twice a week, gave one tenth of his income to the Lord and avoided all the sordid sins. The tax collector, on the other hand, was a traditional crook, he was considered by his own people, a traitor. His singular commitment was making money. He was a bad guy.

They both went to pray. The Pharisee thanked God for making him who he is. He did not really go there to pray. He went to inform God how good he was. He prayed with himself. The tax collector, on the other hand prayed to God in few words. "O God, be merciful to me, a sinner." He did not elaborate. Jesus declared the tax collector went home justified. Jesus did not say the Pharisee was a bad guy and the tax collector a good guy, he only said the tax collector went home justified.

In communities, we see people who think and pray, even if they do not do it louder. "Thank God, I am not like that liberal who is destroying the Thank God, I am not like that conservative who is holding the church in the past. Thank God, I am not like people who are struck with useless devotions." Like the Pharisee we do not know how to deal with God except by comparing ourselves with the other people. The tax collector could have made the same mistake as the Pharisee: he could have looked at the Pharisee and said, "I am sorry, Lord, I am not good like he is." That would have been a less serious mistake, but still a mistake. He did not compare. He went home justified. Aren't you glad when you look like this tax collector?

On Monday, teachers look forward to meeting with HRS families for student conferences. They share sample student work, updated grades, progress monitor assessments, and additional information about each child. It is an important time for teachers and parents to ensure we are working together to benefit the child, individually. At HRS, teachers work with each child during the school day but also sometimes during recess or after school as needed. HRS teachers communicate through a newsletter or weekly email, as well as teacher web pages.

At HRS, here are some of the academic expectations for students:

Homework Time: In general, this is what may be a typical homework guide -

- ✓ K-1 Grade very little, but students should be reading or being read to daily.
- ✓ 2nd Grade 20 minutes per day
- ✓ 3rd Grade 30 minutes per day
- ✓ 4th Grade 40 minutes per day
- ✓ 5th Grade 50 minutes per day
- ✓ 6th Grade 60 minutes per day
- ✓ 7-8th Grade 60-90 minutes per day

If students use time wisely during the school day, their homework time per day will likely be less then what is listed above due to the multiage structure or study hall times available.

<u>Classroom Assignments</u>: HRS Teachers give daily assignments in a variety of formats. Students may have reading and online assignments, projects,

worksheets, and hands-on projects within class time and as homework. These may be as individual assignments, partner projects, or small group work.

Technology Time: Is used to practice skills like reading, writing, spelling, and math. We also learn typing and how to use programs as students get older. In addition, students practice skills using the resources from their textbooks and online assessment practice like Spelling City and Study Island. Students will use their Google Account to save projects they are working on in grades 3-8.

Religion Education & Enrichment: As a Catholic school, our faith is incorporated throughout the school day. From daily classroom prayers and religion lessons, students gain insight and personal growth within their faith. In addition, students experience service projects weekly, attend Adoration and Mass. HRS students are also tested in religion concepts each quarter.
