A Note From The Pastor



This Sunday, St. Luke presents two characters for our prayer and reflection—Martha and Mary, who welcomed Jesus in their house. They were not twins, yet invariably, we think of them together like Laurel and Hardy. Martha and Mary are different with different temperaments. It is their temperamental difference that catches our attention.

In this story Martha and Mary show us the clash of temperaments. Some people are naturally dynamos in activity; others are naturally quiet. It is hard for an active person to understand someone who sits and contemplates. It is also natural that the person who is devoted to meditation and contemplation will look down on the person who is active and dynamic. There is no right or wrong in it, because God did not make everyone alike—some are active and others are quiet. Both serve the community and the community needs both of them. They are not contradictory, they are complementary. They are the two wings of Christian spirituality and perfection.

Another point is, in the matter of showing hospitality; one must look to the other person's needs and tastes. Sometimes we try to love people in our own way and not as the other people wanted it. They cannot comprehend it in that way. That was what happened to Martha. With the cross before Him and tension in His heart, Jesus was traveling to Jerusalem. On His way He visited Martha and Mary. What He needed at that time was some quiet and peace. Martha failed to understand it while Mary understood Jesus' mind very well and responded to it. Jesus needs good Samaritans, Martha's and Mary's to build His kingdom.

Mission Appeal Weekend – July 20 & 21 From the Kabale Diocese, Uganda, Africa

Kabale Diocese is one of 19 dioceses of Uganda, situated in the rural extreme southwestern corner of the country. The diocese borders Rwanda on the SouthWest and the Democratic Republic of Congo on the Western side, and serves a population of 1,500,000 people of whom approximately 700,000 are Roman Catholic.

We are seeking assistance for our long-term Kabale Diocese Orphaned and Vulnerable Children Program. Through our foster home care program, we provide outreach support to orphaned children, the vast majority of whom have lost both parents and are left alone to fend for themselves. We currently provide school tuition, clothing, and healthcare to 350 children out of the well over 20,000 greatly in need of help.

We are also in need of support toward Rushorza Health Center which Kabale Diocese is in the process of constructing. This health center will serve a critical need because of its location in the rural area that serves mostly the poor, and an area that continues to grapple diseases such as malaria, typhoid, HIV/Aids, TB among others. These life-threatening diseases continue to claim a lot of lives, given also that the area has a ratio of one doctor/3,000 people. Once completed, Rushorza Health Center will serve a population of about 700,000 people and will extend its services to our next door neighbors in Rwanda since we are located at the Uganda/Rwanda border.
