Please register to donate online at www.redcrossblood.org or sign-up for an appointment on the sheet located on the kiosk. **Gifts for 1st Time Donors!!** Blood Drives are also scheduled for October 24th and December 19th, 2016. *Whole blood can be given every 56 days.*

If you are at least 17 years old, 16 years old with a signed Red Cross parental/guardian consent form where state permits, weigh at least 110 pounds and are in good health, you may be eligible to give blood. High school students and other donors 18 years old and younger must also meet other height and weight requirements.



Giving blood is safe, simple and helps save lives. Each pint of blood donated may help up to three people. The American Red Cross is the largest single provider of blood in the country. They provide blood to 3,000 hospitals across the country. About 38,000 people need blood each day in the United States.

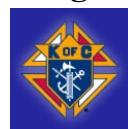
It is time to think Fall Festival...
