KC Auxiliary Meeting is March 10. It will be the Seder meal with a light dinner followed by our meeting with cake and ice cream afterward.



At the start of March, we often hear people comment on the month coming in like a lamb or a lion. Whatever the weather does, we should, according to Pope Francis, "come in like a lamb," at least in how we interact with people. In *Year of Mercy*, the Holy Father says, "The call of Jesus pushes each of us never to stop at the surface of things, especially when we are dealing with a person . . . No one can be excluded from the mercy of God." This thoughtful prayer from Matthew Kelly's *Rediscovering Jesus* also encourages us to look beyond the surface:

Jesus, point me toward the root of things, and give me an extra nudge when I am tempted to settle for the shallow and the superficial.
