Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ June 22, 2014

First Reading	Deuteronomy	8:2-3
Psalms 147	"Praise the Lord, Jerusalem"

A Note From The Pastor



The first thing our parents taught us about our religion was most probably the sign of the cross. The last thing a priest will do at our gravesite is make the sign of the cross over our body. A Christian life is marked "In the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit".

The revelation of God as Father, Son and Spirit tells us, first of all, what God is for us. But as the mysterious unity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit we can only stammer with inadequate human concepts which are not able to express the ineffable mystery of God himself. St. Paul in his letter to the Romans exclaims, "O the depth of the riches and wisdom and knowledge of God. How inscrutable are his judgments and how unfathomable His ways". Clearly no texts can make possible a human understanding of the Trinitarian mystery. But the church used the interpretation of these texts with the guidance of the Holy Spirit to proclaim the Triune of God.

The doctrine of the Holy Trinity is defined by the church as the belief that in God are three persons who subsist in one nature. The doctrine was defined in the 4th and 5th centuries AD and hence is not explicitly and formally a biblical belief. In the unfolding of the Doctrine of Trinity, we owe a lot to Tertullian who introduced three important words in the Trinitarian language. First of all, Tertullian invented the word Trinity, which since his time became so characteristic a feature of Christian theology. Secondly, he introduced the word person, persona in Latin, which literally means a mask. Thirdly, he introduced the word substance, to express the idea of a fundamental unity within the Godhead. Substance is what the three persons of the Trinity have in common. Our redemption is thus the result of the three persons of the Godhead acting in distinct yet coordinated manner in human history without any loss of the total unity of the Godhead.
