Epiphany of the Lord January 7, 2018

First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6

Psalms 72 "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you."

Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12a

The readings reflect the joy of the Epiphany of the Lord event. Isaiah sings of the promise of post-exilic Jerusalem, receiving people and treasures from all nations. The author of Ephesians proclaims that in Christ Jesus we are all members of the same body, that Jew and Gentile alike have received the promise of salvation. The faraway magi in Matthew follow the star to Bethlehem and pay homage to the newborn king.
