First Reading Isaiah 50:5-9a

Psalm 34 "I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living."

Second Reading James 2:14-18 8:27-35 Gospel: Mark

In the Sunday Gospels from now until the end of October, Jesus explains what it means to be his disciple. When Peter declared Jesus to be the Christ, Jesus explains that he will be the kind of Messiah Isaiah describes in the first reading, God's servant who willingly suffers to save God's people. Only by taking up our cross and following Jesus in self-sacrificing love can we share his resurrection. In the second reading, James teaches that following Jesus should inspire us to alleviate the suffering of others.

## From the Pastor ....



# "Show no partiality as you hold the faith of our Lord Jesus Christ." (James 2:1)

I can't recall correctly where and when I read the following. But still it is fresh in my memory because I think there is a valuable lesson in it we all have to learn. Once Robert Lee, the great U.S. army leader was travelling by train together with some of his soldiers and other officers. At a station a poor and old woman entered the compartment. As there was no vacant seat and no one cared to offer her any she was standing all along, till Robert Lee spotted her and offered At once, everyone in the her his seat. compartment stood up and offered their seat to him. Lee then said something that shamed them all. He remarked: "No, gentlemen, if you cannot give your seat to an old and poor woman, you cannot give it to me either."


Favoritism in any form is against the tenants' of Christian faith. All are children of God. Partiality is evil because it leads to division in the church and society. Discrimination against the poor contradicts God's plan and design. God is always on the side of the poor and the weak. In the second reading today, James writes in his letter, "Listen, my dear brothers. God chose the poor people of this world to be rich in faith and to possess the kingdom...but you dishonor the poor." (James 2:5-6)

Partiality is pernicious. And it is unfortunately very pervasive too. Different people are partial on different grounds. St. James condemns partiality between the poor and the rich. Human beings have an innate inclination to side with the rich and the powerful. We despise the poor, look down upon the powerless while we honor the wealthy and the mighty. Poor nations, weak teams, downtrodden sections of society are always ignored, taken for granted and given step-motherly treatment. No one cared to offer a seat to an old woman while there were many to offer for a General.

Partiality from a Superior, Principal, Parish Priest etc., not only divide the group, it demoralizes it as well. It turns off the offended persons and as far as they are concerned the Leader is rendered ineffective. Virtually, he ceases to be their leader. Those who are partial lose all credibility. Such persons create grudges and bitterness in others, which are difficult to be healed and forgiven.

Campaigning through his state, the late Senator Clyde Hoey of North Carolina stopped at a church in a small town and was greeted by the Minister. "How many members do you have in your church?" the Senator asked. "Fifty", the pastor replied. "And how many active members?" "Fifty," the pastor replied. "Fifty members and fifty active? You must be a good preacher," the Senator said. "Yes, Sir – Fifty members: twenty-five active for me and twenty-five active against me," the Minster said. Fr. George, CMI
