Tony first played a musical instrument at age 2, when his mother Janice bought him a Magnus Chord Organ. He now plays 23 instruments and will perform at St. Albert the Great in Minneapolis on Sept. 13. Such is the unusual life of an **autistic** savant, who also happens to be **blind**. The simplest tasks in life — like combing hair — can be a grueling challenge for him to learn. Yet, something as daunting as performing a concert in front of an audience full of strangers — which he has done since age 9 — doesn't faze him in the least.
