A Note From The Pastor



“Do not let your hearts be troubled, believe in God and believe in me”-says Jesus. Most of us know what a troubled heart is, its nature and condition. It is restless, there is no peace in a troubled heart. It is expressed in anger, rage, depression and frustration. If your heart is troubled, you yell at everyone, you lose interest in studies and work, you are not friendly with people, you hate and criticize others, you lose your sense of humor and sleep. All areas of your life is affected. Now the question is, “Is this the answer for your problem? No, it is not. It will only worsen the problem. You have to know what exactly your problem is. If you make an honest search you will find out that most of these troubles are creations of your own mind and all of them are senseless, meaningless and useless. Just to cite one example, I remember the story of an old lady who got her house painted. As the painter left in the evening, her husband forgot himself and leaned against the wall and left a distinct hand mark on the fresh paint. The lady soon made her feelings clearly known. She was angry at him. Her husband tried to calm her down. What is the fuss, he said, the painter is returning tomorrow and so he will paint it over. Nevertheless, she found it difficult to understand. She kept yelling at him until the next day the painter repainted it. We may think it as an extreme case. But the fact is there are a lot of people of the same nature among us. People who get upset and troubled with silly and petty things. If you carefully analyze all your troubles and botherations, you will understand that many of them are unnecessary, meaningless and useless. The only way to get out of it is to turn to yourself instead of turning to others. What is needed is a very true and real view of life, things and people. For that we need real faith, faith in God. Jesus says, “Don’t let your hearts be troubled, have faith in God and also faith in me.” Life is precious and worth living. And there is only one life. Do not waste it on unnecessary worries and anxieties. Don’t make it a mess with stupidity-believe, God is in control.

Spring field trips extend and enrich student learning! HRS students have been experiencing extended learning this spring with educational field trips, lyceums and adventures. This last week students learned all about baby animals thanks to the Baby Animal day with FFA. Our youngest learners traveled to the Children's Museum in Mankato to explore hands-on experiments. Our 3-6th grade traveled down the Mississippi River and hiked through Fort Snelling. They studied our environment, Minnesota history, and our water. These students had a lot of preparatory work and water experiments before the trip. Next week, our 1-4th grades will be going to Farm America – another grand adventure extending both social studies and science learning. Last week HRS also hosted a Laser Science Light Show. This was a fantastic and entertaining show that taught about light and the importance of science and math. It was a hit with the students! Extending learning opportunities outside of the classroom is key to building enriching experiences for all HRS students. HRS was awarded a STEM (Science, Technology, Environment and Math) Grant last Tuesday night. We will be using these funds to purchase a new STEM program that will begin in our 5-6 class and Learning Center for 3-4th grade students for the 2014-15 school year.
