Holy Trinity Sunday June 15, 2014

First Reading	Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9
Daniel 3	"Glory and praise forever."
Second Reading	2 Corinthians 13:11-13
Gospel:	John 3:16-18

When Jesus commands his disciples to go and baptize in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, he is naming for all time the mystery of the Holy Trinity, and telling his disciples that baptism into the Church is baptism into this mystery. We who have been baptized are, as Saint Paul says, led by the Spirit of God and indeed are children of God, joint heirs with Christ. As we listen to the words, let us reflect on what it means to us to be baptized into the mystery of the Trinity.

A Note From The Pastor



The annual Celebration of the Paschal Mystery that began on Ash Wednesday culminates at Pentecost. It recounts the outpouring of the spirit on the Apostles. Pentecost is a disturbing event. Once the spirit enters into a person, it takes complete possession of that person, and it urges the person to live according to the inspiration of the spirit. The spirit is not a tame force, carefully bottled in ecclesiastical institutions, available to be served out in rational doses according to the decision of the hierarchy or the ministry of specially illuminated saints. He is the Lord of the church, not subject to human control and like the wind he blows wherever he chooses.

The spirit of God does not blow always gently. At Pentecost he came like the rush of a mighty wind. Since then the same mighty spirit has been known to blow shaking the foundations of mighty but unjust social systems and institutions. It strikes down many of the established, corrupted structures and systems in the society and asks for a reconstruction and rebuilding. At Pentecost, he came as tongues of fire and consumed the hearts of the disciples so powerfully that he drove them out of Jerusalem, scattering them like seeds all over the earth.

On the day of Pentecost, the Spirit, with a strong wind and consuming fire, broke down the walls that separated man from man. As the fire makes clay pots strong, so the spirit makes us strong in our faith. As the fire makes a piece of iron soft, so the spirit makes our iron will stubbornness into one of docility and humility. As the fire gives light to our eyes, so the Spirit gives light to our confused minds and complicated desires. With the Psalmist we cry out, "Lord, send out your spirit and renew the face of the Earth".

Most Holy Redeemer School kicked off summer with our 3rd Annual Block Party – moved to June for the warmer weather. Attendees played cards, enjoyed a vintage snowmobile show, delicious food, and celebrated the beginning of summer while supporting HRS students. Thank you to everyone who attended and a special thank you to:

- HRS 3-4th grade parents helped coordinate event
- HRS staff – Rick Skluzacek, Lisa Zoubek and Michelle Sladek who added to it's success
- KC's who once again provided their services to cook at the event and donate their proceeds

Creating successful fundraisers that raise over \$4,000 for each event is a challenge at Catholic Schools. In recent years, HRS has planned to increase the profits of each fundraiser while eliminating smaller fundraisers that were not as successful or took too many volunteer hours.

Our biggest fundraiser, however, is the gifts that we receive each year from donors, parishioners, alumni, businesses, and families in donations and grants. WE THANK YOU FOR ALL OF YOUR PRAYERS AND SUPPORT! This support partnered with our top fundraisers helped our school support our students, provide for our staff, and maintain our building. Our top fundraisers outside of grants and donations raise approximately this much each, annually, for HRS students:

- Marathon: \$15,000

- Golf Tournament: \$8,000
- Home & School Raffle: \$4,700
- Block Party: \$4,000
- Kolacky Days: \$3,500
- HRS Board Raffle: \$3,300

In all, HRS raises about \$100,000 each year through donations, grants, and fundraising events. This is up from about \$50,000 four years ago. We hope to raise the profits of both the Block Party and Kolacky Days again this year. Watch for reports in future bulletins. Instead of adding fundraisers, by increasing our profits we become more sufficient as a school.

Each year, HR School has decreased the subsidy we receive from the parish. Last year we decreased our subsidy by \$10,000. The subsidy helps to cover the school's gas, electric, repairs, supplies, and janitorial needs 24 hours a day, 12 months a year regardless of who is using the building. We want to be good stewards as a parish school but also keep the parish aware of the true costs of operations for our building. An updated school end of year report will be highlighted in July.
