A Note From Father Victor

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our scripture readings this Sunday teaches us about love of God and love of neighbor. When Jesus was asked about the greatest commandment among the 613 laws in the Torah, he referred to a daily prayer of his people found in Deuteronomy 5: to love God with all your soul, mind and heart. And then he quoted from the book of Leviticus 19: love your neighbor as yourself as the next important commandment. Scripture readings this weekend identify the neighbor as those who are immigrants, orphans and widows. They were the poor, powerless and vulnerable. They were those who could not almost defend or protect themselves. Jesus invites us to help and love them as we love our very selves.

Love of God is the force behind loving our neighbor. The experience of God's love brings about wholeness and indescribable joy within our heart and this love urges us to share that same love to others. We are loved by God even to the point of sending his only begotten son for our salvation. We are loved in a way we are so undeserving for it. Yet we are loved. In the same way we are called to love others. We are invited to reflect deep within ourselves how we are loved. We are invited to reflect how deep is my desire for the God that loves us.

Two important aspects of faith living is brought forth in front of us. First is the inner disposition of knowing the love of God and experiencing it. How does that love bring forth a relationship between us and our God? The second is the giving of expression of that faith/loving relationship in our way of worship and living and loving others. How do we serve others? What's in our hearts when we do things for others?

Our experience of God's love should bring us to an awareness and sensitivity to the concerns of our brothers and sisters. How is this manifested in our lives and in our involvement in our parish community?
