First Reading: Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24  
Psalm 30

*"I will praise you, Lord,  
for you have rescued me".*

Second Reading: 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15

Gospel: Mark 5:21-43

The first line of the first reading, from the book of Wisdom, sets the tone for the Liturgy of the Word: "God did not make death." In the Gospel Jesus heals a woman with an incurable illness and raises Jairus' daughter to life. The key to both miracles is the faith of those who approach him. We can listen to all of the readings for passages that point to God's preference for life and reflect on how our faith can grow in response.

# A Note From Father Victor ....

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Our local church goes through another storm as our archbishop and his coadjutor resigned amidst the process of cleansing itself from the scandals of the past. This is another painful blow in our life as a church. So many have asked when will this storm be over?

The scripture readings this Sunday talks about the "storms in the life of Job" and how he has complained to God. The gospel reading talked about the "fears" of the disciples of Jesus when they were in the midst of the storm. They cried: "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?" Isn't that our complaint as well?

While the big waves were tossing, threatening the small boat, surprisingly Jesus was peacefully asleep in the midst of the terrifying storm. Let us take note of the contrasting peace of Jesus and the restless hearts of his disciples. It takes humility and trust to realize that God is God. He and his love are beyond our understanding. He loves us and as in the scripture readings about the storm, he will calm the storms in our life. Like Jesus we are called to a total trust in God. Let us be reminded we are cherished and held closely to God's heart. Our storm is a storm of purification. We will allow it to be because we trust in God and have a sense that there is nothing that we can't face with that sense of God at our side. Saint Paul said "if God is with us, who can be against us?"

Take note of Jesus' powerful words to calm the storm: "quiet and be still". Let us trust that whatever we are going through in our lives and in the life of our church, our God is a mighty God! Let God be God to us!

## UNITED STATES BANKRUPTCY COURT DISTRICT OF MINNESOTA

In re: The Archdiocese of Saint Paul and  
 Minneapolis Case No. 15-30125  
**YOU MAY HAVE A CLAIM AGAINST**  
**THE ARCHDIOCESE OF SAINT PAUL AND**  
**MINNEAPOLIS**

On January 16, 2015, The Archdiocese of  
 Saint Paul and Minneapolis filed for protection  
 under Chapter 11 of Title 11 of the United  
 States Code.

The last day to file a SEXUAL ABUSE CLAIM,  
GENERAL CLAIM, or GOVERNMENT CLAIM  
against the Debtor is August 3, 2015.

- If you were sexually abused by any person  
 connected with the debtor, then you must file a  
 claim by August 3, 2015. Sexual abuse, as used  
 in this notice, includes molestation, rape, undue  
 familiarity, sexually-related physical,  
 psychological or emotional harm, or contacts or  
 interactions of a sexual nature between a child  
 and an adult, or a non-consenting adult and  
 another adult.

- If you are a person, entity, or Governmental  
 Unit (as defined by Bankruptcy Code § 101(27)),  
 and claim any right to payment or to an  
 equitable remedy for breach of performance if  
 such breach gives rise to a right to payment,  
 then you must file a claim by August 3, 2015.
