## A Note From Father Victor ....



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Sunday we are invited to reflect on the sign of the cross, the central symbol of our faith. To many the cross symbolizes suffering and defeat and reminds us of the death of Jesus on the cross. But we insist on making it the sign of our faith. Why?

The story of the cross is not a story of death and defeat. The cross is transformative. His death on the cross was the cause Jesus was "highly exalted" by the Father. By the cross Jesus achieved life eternal. It was therefore victorious not a defeat. The old testament story about the poisonous snakes and the bronze serpent on a pole and the assurance to Moses that whoever was bitten and looked up at the bronze serpent would be saved from death gives us an insight to the meaning of the mystery of the cross. Thus is the central meaning of the cross for us: by keeping our attention focused on Jesus mounted and later raised up from the cross we too will be saved from death and gain eternal life. "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life." John wants to tell us that whoever believes and picks his eyes on Jesus lifted up will never die but will have eternal life. This is the promise of God the Father.

Thus the cross is a sign of victory and life!

We build our community with this sign of the cross. We bear our cross and face our challenges knowing that his will transform us to become stronger and faithful. It builds courage and gives hope. Therefore as the "Old Rugged Cross" song goes:

And I'll cherish the Old Rugged Cross  
Till my trophies at last I lay down  
And I will cling to the Old Rugged Cross  
And exchange it some day for a crown
