It is easy to be distracted by the tactics of the Sadducees in the Gospel and miss Jesus' larger point. So as we hear the Gospel, be sure to look for Jesus' conclusion that God is God of the living. It was faith in this God that sustained the seven brothers and their mother through their terrible ordeal. As we hear the readings at Mass, let us be mindful of how the faith that we proclaim in our Creed, "the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting," sustains us as well.

A Note From The Pastor



Alfred Nobel invented the dynamite and he amassed untold amount of wealth by this invention. In 1888, he was shown a copy of his obituary that was to be published at his death. After reading it, Alfred was extremely unhappy as he realized that he is going to be remembered in the world as the father of atom bombs who amassed huge amounts of wealth with the killer weapon. He came to his senses and made up his mind to utilize all the wealth he had earned by this invention for the betterment of the world and thus the Nobel Prize was established.

In the Gospel of today we encounter Zachaeus. Jesus' call and his stay with Zachaeus enable him to have a complete turnaround in his way of life. He emphatically announces that he will give away half of his possessions to the poor and if he has extorted anything from anyone he will repay it four times over.

The experience of Zachaeus vehemently proclaims to each of us that conversion or transformation without cost is not conversion at all. True conversion, as it occurred in the life of Zachaeus requires of us to give up our old self and put on Christ. This is how Jesus sums up the purpose of his ministry at the end of the Gospel. "The Son of Man has come to seek and save the lost." Salvation is available to everyone. We are free to accept it or reject it.
