Founded in 1979 by the Archdiocesan Council of Catholic Women, the Appalachia Christmas Mission is a wonderful program that has brought joy to numerous families in Kentucky by encouraging many parishes, religious education / youth groups and CCW groups to collect Christmas gifts for all ages.
