Dear Brothers and Sisters,
This Sunday our church celebrate “world mission Sunday”. Once a year we take time to reflect on the mission of Jesus and how we an participate on it as a parish. We are “one body” thus we are “All the Church for all the World”. How should we, as a parish, express our solidarity with the church in its mission? There are three ways we can give expressions to our Christ’s mission. Most importantly, we do something locally. Let us become aware that around us we can make known Jesus good news in word and good deeds. Let us put our faith into action. Let us become conscious about the needs of so many around us and respond to their concerns. Let us have the courage to give witness to the truth, love and justice of God through different advocacies in the community. Secondly, we can support world mission. There are more than a thousand mission dioceses and endeavors throughout the world. WE can share with them our gifts to support their missionary works. Thirdly, and very essential in the work of mission is prayer. Let us not ever forget to pray for all the missionaries and the good work they are doing in other countries/places.

The scripture readings this weekend invite us to reflect on Christ’s “spirit” in fulfilling his mission. Christ’s solidarity with the people, living with and like them except for sin. He “sympathized with our weakness” and “tested in every way”. He offered his life “as an offering for sin”, to save humanity. He showed us mercy and forgiveness, freedom and restoration. James and John did not actually know what it means to sit at his “right or his left”. His mission is achieved not through position nor power but through humility and service. The power and glory was not Jesus’ but the Father’s.
