First Reading Sirach 35:12-14,16-18
Psalm 34 *"The Lord hears the cry of the poor."*
Second Reading 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18
Gospel: Luke 18:9-14

The scriptures this weekend offer us more about prayer. The Gospel presents the parable of the Pharisee and the publican, the two men who go to the temple area to pray. Notice how Jesus says the Pharisee speaks his prayer to himself, while the tax collector raises an actual prayer to God. What can these readings tell us about the sincerity of our prayers? Are we praying to God, or to ourselves.

A Note From The Pastor



Every gift deserves a "Thank you." Today's readings focus on the obligation of giving thanks. They challenge us to awaken from our lethargy of ingratitude. They insist that we put aside our concentration on self in order to dwell on the goodness of others. Moreover, they demand a concrete recognition of such goodness. They proclaim that every gift requires a "Thank you." Gratitude, like charity, should begin at home. These biblical passages should prompt an awareness of other's kindness toward us, and gratitude based on that awareness. The love and concern of parents and other family members must be recognized for what they are, namely, great gifts for generous hearts. Instead of taking them for granted, we are urged to pause and reflect on our good fortune. In view of such awareness we are challenged to offer our thanks. Our gratitude can take the form of imitation. Where we have received sympathy, support and concern, we can give sympathy, support and concern in return. In this way, the generosity of the giver is never lost. It takes flesh whenever we seek to recall that gift in a new situation.
