### 15<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time July 13, 2014

**First Reading** Isaiah 55:10-11  
**Psalm 65** "The seed that falls on good ground will yield a fruitful harvest"  
**Second Reading** Romans 8:18-23  
**Gospel:** Matthew 13:1-23

The Gospel is the well-known story of the sower and the seed. Often when we hear this story, we think about who among us is the rocky ground, or whether the seed has fallen on the path or among the thorn in our own lives. But it may be that the Gospel is about God's lavish generosity – the seed of God's word is flung everywhere, and it takes root in unexpected places, and bears fruit far beyond usual expectations. Isaiah says as much when he says God's word will not return void. Let us make our hearts ready to receive the abundant and fertile word of God.

## A Note From The Pastor ....



TV coverage of World Cup was a wonderful scientific achievement, linking people worldwide with the event simultaneously. Barriers of distance, oceans, mountains and natural boundaries were overcome as the pictures were relayed to satellite and beamed back into homes across the planet. Interest and technological expertise united millions of people of many races, colors and creeds. Hopefully, this link up will lead to a better understanding between peoples and anything that improves mutual acceptance is to be encouraged.

But despite such linkups, our world is a divided and violent one, with dissension not only between countries but within countries and within families. Despite being created as one human family, we continue to live as islands of fear and selfishness. The barrier that renders us unable to reach out trustfully to one another is an attitude of mind and heart that sees might as right when power and privilege are on our side.

No technology can overcome this barrier. Only the Spirit of God can accomplish this task. This spirit shows itself in sincerity rather than self-righteousness, in simplicity rather than success, in reverence rather than rejection, in acceptance rather than achievement. Reverence is strength built on faith. Gentleness is strength founded on love. Such gentleness was the core of the life and teachings of Jesus as we hear in today's Gospel.
