The Gospel is a difficult one, because Jesus says that he has come to bring not peace, but division. Jeremiah too was accused of demoralizing the people. What could possibly be the good news in these readings? Perhaps the answer is in the passage from the Letter to the Hebrews. Just as Jesus persevered through his passion and cross and is now glorified, so we who follow Christ will see our reward even though our witness may cause division as well.
