Second Reading:	Ephesians	4:17, 20-24
Gospel:	John	6:24-35

“The Lord gave them bread from heaven,” we sing in the responsorial psalm, and we hear two examples of this generosity in the readings. In Exodus, the Lord provided manna to the Chosen People when they were famished in the desert. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the crowd that God gives them the true bread from heaven: Jesus, the Bread of Life. As Saint Paul writes to the Ephesians, nourished by Jesus, we can now “put on the new self.”

A Word from Father Victor ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is important that from time to time we are reminded about the significance of going to Sunday mass regularly. It is a common experience that as we leave after the celebration of the Eucharist there is always a feeling of being fed and a sense of goodness and satisfaction. More than gaining insights about life or a spiritual nourishment, there is a satisfaction of a deeper hunger, the hunger for life, its meaning and fulfillment, a deeper longing that only God can satisfy.

The reading about Elisha and the few loaves of bread and the story about Jesus' multiplication of loaves and the feeding of thousands is also about a deep longing, to the point of hunger of the people and God comes to satisfy the hunger. The abundance of the Father's grace for life is signified in the leftovers after everyone has eaten. All these stories prefigure as well the last supper in which Jesus tells us, directly or indirectly, that he is the bread of life that will be broken in order to give us life.

IN Jesus we have life. Yes, in the celebration of the Eucharist we remember, celebrate and believe in the abundance of God's love and his constant nourishment of our hunger. Every Sunday we gather to be nourished and give thanks.

Religious Ed News...

We are now accepting registrations for our 2018-19 Religious Ed program. Classes for Grades 1 - 10 are held Wednesday evenings. Pre-School /Kindergarten is during 9 a.m. Mass Sunday morning. Classes go Mid-September through April. We are especially looking for youth in Grades 1 & 3 for the upcoming year. Please call the office for the necessary paperwork.



Youth in 2nd Grade receive preparation for First Reconciliation and First Communion. Our youth are Confirmed in Grade 10, however, we have a 2 year program so youth MUST BE IN CLASS for both grades. Youth in Grades 6-12 are encouraged to join Youth Group Activities 2X/month.

Our program has awesome Teachers! Through the year youth are also exposed to the celebration of the Mass, basic prayers, Eucharistic Adoration, Stations of the Cross, the Rosary, Service activities including a Food For Kidz Pack and visiting speakers. Parents are encouraged to sit in on their children's classes to see what they're learning.

Families new to our program receive a discounted tuition rate of \$40 per student in Grades 1, 3-9 and \$60 for youth in Grade 2 & 10. There is no charge for Pre-School/Kindergarten but we request the paperwork be filled out. Returning Families, not registered by June 1st, pay the regular rate of \$60 for youth in Grades 1, 3-9 and \$80 for youth in Grade 2 & 10.

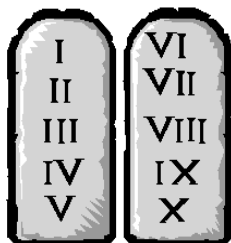
