Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time February 9, 2014

First Reading Isaiah 58:7-10
Psalm 112 "The just man is a light in darkness to the upright."

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 2:1-5
Gospel: Matthew 5:13-16

This year's theme of light continues. The reading from Isaiah speaks of all the deeds that show that one is just, and that light shall rise for the just one out of darkness. Jesus tells us that we are the light of the world and must not hide our light under a bushel. The psalm sings that the just one is a light in the darkness to the upright. Can we hear what we must do to be the light of the world?

A Note From The Pastor



Chapter 13 of the book of Exodus prescribed that every first born Israelite son and animal belonged to God. The Jews presented their firstborn. They carried out God's instruction with a rite called presentation and redemption or buying back. That is, they sacrificed to God their animals and brought back from God their sons. The explanation for this ritual dates from God's rescue of Israelites from Egypt. Pharaoh freed the Israelites only after all first born sons and animals of the Egyptians died. Israel's first born, on the other hand, were spared and freed from Egyptian slavery. They, therefore, belonged to God who spared them and freed them.

An ancient tradition says that a child is never given to parents by God, only lent to them. This tradition helps us appreciate better the spirit of God's instruction to Moses "dedicate all the first born males to me".

When Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple 40 days after his birth for his presentation to the Lord, an old man called Simeon identified him as the promised messiah and was moved by the Holy Spirit he took him into his arms and blessed God in these words, "now master you may dismiss your servant in peace". He knew he was holding the Savior in his arms and he was ready to die. He also foretold four things about Jesus. First, he will meet with opposition; second, he will be a vehicle for the destruction and salvation for the many in Israel; third, he will be a glory to Israel; and finally, he will be a light to the gentiles. Also, he said to Mary "and you yourself a sword will pierce". That prophecy was fulfilled when Mary looks up at this same Jesus hanging on the cross.
