

Fourth Sunday of Lent March 30, 2014

First Reading1 Samuel 16:1b,6-7,10-13 **Psalm 23**"The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want."

Second Reading Ephesians 5:8-14 **Gospel:** John 9:1-41

The dominant metaphors in these readings are sight and blindness, light and darkness. In the first reading, even the great judge Samuel needed time to learn to see as God does. Our Gospel is the familiar story of the healing of the man born blind, who gains more and more sight as the Pharisees grow more and more blind. Saint Paul tells us to live as children of the light. Let us pray to God to light the way of our own lives.

A Note From The Pastor



The Old Testament reading today pictures the children of Israel wandering in the wilderness of Sinai. God delivered them from the forces of Pharaoh, from slavery in Egypt. They saw God's power in the Red Sea. They heard God's concern for them through the words of Moses. Yet, they are grumbling against Moses. And worse, they are so fearful that God will abandon them in the wilderness that some of them are longing to return to Egypt. Egypt, the place of slave labor, the place of an angry Pharaoh and the place of death.

It only took God a few weeks to get Israel out of Egypt. But it took him forty years to get Egypt out of Israel. Let us see what we can learn from this sad chapter in Israel's story. First, Israel remembered the past better than it was. Memory edits and magnifies. Most of us remember the past in a glorified way. School days were brighter, early marriage was easier, our kids were better behaved, society was gentler. We simply edit out of our memory the difficult and painful parts of the past. Israel remembered Egypt better than it was. They had forgotten the hardships, the slavery and the brutality of the Pharaoh. How tempting it is to return to the place of the past, even if it represents torment, just because the known is safer than the unknown.

Second, Israel considered the present worse than it Sure, they were thirsty. overestimated their difficulty. They forgot about the God who brought them out of Egypt. A God who could part the sea, could provide water for them too. But their momentary discomfort made them forgetful and cranky. Things haven't changed that much. Just let the temperature vary 10 degrees from the perfect in the sanctuary, we would all lose a bit of our piety too. The present does not speak for the future. And the present does not exhaust the possibilities of God or future. Are you lonely, sick or poor today? Maybe this present moment is setting the stage for God's greatest work in your life. Try not to repeat Israel's





Parish Pastoral Council News

Chrism Mass - Thursday, April 10

All the Faithful are invited to the annual Chrism Mass which will be celebrated at the Cathedral of Saint Paul on Thursday, April 10 at 7 p.m. Join with others from throughout our local Church in this tradition that dates back to the early Church. At this Mass the bishop blesses three oils — the oil of catechumens (oleum catechumenorum or oleum sanctorum), the oil of the infirm (oleum infirmorum) and holy chrism (sacrum chrisma) — which will be used in the administration of the sacraments throughout the diocese during the year. In addition, all priests present will publically renew their priestly promises.
