Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Who is my neighbor? The lawyer asked Jesus in the gospel reading this weekend. Jesus used a parable to send the powerful message that love transcends boundaries. It serves anyone who is in need, even with different orientations, political viewpoints, race or age. The question was asking for a criteria whom to help. Jesus' answer: everyone. Here is the radical call of Jesus: Love one another. Here is the challenge: are we ready to reach out to everyone and care for those who need help. Am I ready and willing to open my self for others?

When Jesus loves, he opens his arms on the cross. He goes beyond his personal boundaries and exceeds expectations. His love is so far reaching. Sometimes fear overcomes the ability to love and to serve. There is fear for taken advantaged, or being rejected or laughed at. Jesus overcame all these fear and his love made him courageous. How deep is your love?

Our world needs that kind of love that Jesus showed us. And when he showed that love he was desiring that his witnesses embrace that same love and share that love to everyone. His love can overcome division, his care can heal hurts. His compassion bring about reconciliation and peace. His truthfulness produces justice. His love is all that we need to bring happiness and peace in our world.

Please register to donate online at www.redcrossblood.org or sign-up for an appointment on the sheet located on the kiosk. **Gifts for 1st Time Donors!!** Blood Drives are also scheduled for October 24th and December 19th, 2016. Whole blood can be given every 56 days. If you are at least 17 years old, 16 years old with a signed Red Cross parental/guardian consent form where state permits, weigh at least 110 pounds and are in good health, you may be eligible to give blood. High school students and other donors 18 years old and younger must also meet other height and weight requirements. Giving blood is safe, simple and helps save lives. Each pint of blood donated may help up to three people. The American Red Cross is the largest single provider of blood in the country. They provide blood to 3,000 hospitals across the country, and about 38,000 people in the US each day.
