### **Epiphany of the Lord January 5<sup>th</sup>, 2014**

**First Reading** Isaiah 60:1-6  
**Psalm 72** "Lord, every nation on earth will adore you"  
**Second Reading** Ephesians 3:2-3a,5-6  
**Gospel:** Matthew 2:1-12  
Our readings today are all about the manifestation of the child Jesus to the world. The magi come from a foreign land. Isaiah sings of nations coming to bear gifts and proclaim the goodness of the Lord. Saint Paul tells us that salvation is for all, not just for the Jews. As we listen to these scriptures today, let us ponder what it is about this child that draws foreigners and strangers to him. What draws is to him?

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph have much to tell us about our fast-paced busy life. What made this family Holy or ideal or perfect? We cannot give all the credits to Jesus. The Holiness of this family came from the Dad's and Mom's response to the call of God. Mary and Joseph did everything according to the law of Moses. Jesus was not only God, but also a human. And for the full growth of his humanity his parents Mary and Joseph created an environment in their home this is mostly the need of the time and principle responsibility of parents today. The greatest threat today facing our families is that we don't spend enough time together.
