Fifth Sunday of Lent March 17, 2013

First Reading
Psalm 126

"The Lord has done great things for us, we are filled with joy."

Second Reading Philippians 3:8-14 **Gospel:** John 8:1-11

In the first reading, the Lord opens a way in the sea, and a way in the desert. In the Gospel, Jesus finds a way out of a seemingly impossible situation for the woman caught in adultery. God is doing something new, and Saint Paul, in his letter to the Philippians, can see what it is as he strains toward what lies ahead. What new paths is God opening up for you today.

From the Desk of the Pastor....



The three readings of today deal with homecoming. The Gospel of Luke celebrates the homecoming of a wayward son. The second reading from St. Paul rejoices in the homecoming or reconciliation of a sinner with God. The 1st reading from the book of Joshua remembers the triumphant homecoming of the people of Israel to Canaan, the Promised Land. The imagery in the Gospel is a powerful one. There is that road running stretching out from the wayward son to the loving father. The road may be straight or curved, paved or gravel covered. Whatever may be the nature, it is a long road and there is a figure at each end. One is walking slowly not sure about what to expect when his destination is reached. But just enough hope keeps him moving. At the other end there is one who is waiting looking hard to see if someone might be coming off in the distance. This is the image presented to us by Luke in his Gospel.

Our life is a long road stretched before us and we are on one end and God on the other end. The great reconciler is always there ready to throw His arms around us and to receive us. For reconciliation, some must be willing to, not counting faults, but start running down the road at the first glimpse of the wayward one. Reconciliation requires asking forgiveness and granting it. Neither of them is an easy task. Being at either end of the road is quite a humbling thing. In the parable we see a father who lucked out with neither of his sons. This poor man loved both his sons, though the younger one was too wild and ungrateful and the older one too inflexible and mean spirited. Each in his own way exploited the father. But the father's response to them was not holding anything against his sons and extending to them unlimited patience and unconditional love. The message is: no matter what we have done or not done. God waits for us to come as the father waited for his wayward son. It means that having sinned you need not flee from God's presence. We can be reconciled and receive Gods' unconditional love. Jesus never intended His church to be a refrigerator in which to preserve the perishable piety. Rather, He intended His church to be an incubator in which to hatch converts.
