### **Presentation of the Lord February 2, 2014**

**First Reading**            Malachi            3:1-4  
**Psalm 24**                "Who is this king of glory?  
   It is the Lord."

**Second Reading**        Hebrews            2:14-18  
**Gospel:**                 Luke                2:22-40

With Christmas Time well past, we hear one more manifestation story about the infant Jesus. Devout Jews Mary and Joseph, fulfilling the requirements of the law, bring Jesus to the temple to present him to the Lord. While they are there, Simeon and Anna prophesy about Jesus, telling them – and us – of both the challenge and the redemption that Jesus will bring. Saint Paul tells us that Jesus became one of us in order to save us. As we listen to the words, let us rejoice in the salvation that we have found in Jesus our Lord.

## A Note From The Pastor ....



The scripture text for today gives us a glimpse of early New Testament Church, the Church at Corinth. They were founded by the missionary work of the Apostle Paul. He spent 18 months in Corinth and visited the city on many occasions. Despite the constant attention of Paul, the church in Corinth was on the brink of collapse. The threat to the church was not from any external forces, it was internal. They were collapsing from within. Paul is distressed over their divisions and petty fighting. So he urges the church to become united. What is this Christian unity? One way to define a thing is to say what it is not. Paul is not advocating Christian cloning. The church will never find its unity by insisting that all her members look alike, sound alike or think alike. Paul knows that the church is composed of people with different backgrounds, personalities and spiritual gifts. In fact Paul urges the Corinthians to respect the diversity of the body of Christ and celebrate their different gifts. Paul's point is that the difference among them should not become an issue of division between them. The source of unity is Christ. Jesus Christ is what we all share in common. In him alone is our Christian unity. So let us not urge others to be like us, let us urge each other to be like Christ. Unity is the harmony of diversity centered around Christ. The goal is not that we all become identical, but that we all become more Christ like. When we do this we begin to see our differences as blessings that enrich the church.

We are many skilled positions, but one team. Would a forest be lovelier if it had only one type of tree? The church is stronger when she embraces all kinds of people who profess Jesus Christ. The Church is healthier when she reaches across all economic lines. The church is brighter when she encourages theological dialogue. Members may look different from each other, but all bear the likeness of Father in heaven. Members must treat each other as family. All families have this fights and feuds. The Church is no exception. There is always the possibility of division and conflicts. But the unity is restored when we all put Christ at the center of things. Jesus was a bridge builder. He sought to bring Jews and gentiles together around a common faith.
