First Reading: Isaiah 49: 3, 5-6

Psalm 40 "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1: 1-3

Gospel: John 1: 29-34

Isaiah, Paul, & John the Baptist were each called by God for a special purpose. Isaiah tells us of being called to reach out first to the exiled people of Israel & then to all nations. Paul tells the Corinthians that he was called to be an apostle. John was called to make Jesus known by baptizing with water. Now it is our turn to listen for God's call. Then we can respond, as we do in today's psalm, "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will."
