First Reading: 2 Chronicles 36:14-16

Psalm 116 "Let my tongue be silenced, if I ever forget you."

Second Reading: Ephesians 2:4-10

Gospel: John 3:14-21

# A Note From Father Victor ....



March 8, 2015

Dear Brother and Sisters,

On the third Sunday of Lent we are invited to reflect on our manner and attitude towards worshipping our God. Through the scripture readings this weekend Jesus tells us that the one essential part of worship is our presence and inner disposition. The best offering for Jesus is the offering of the heart more than the sacrificial offerings of things.

In worship we acknowledge God's holiness and goodness and his claim on us. We recognize that we are his beloved and chosen people, and our lives should reflect our giftedness and his holiness. The first reading reminds us of a covenant we have with our God and the conditions of life expected of us. In the gospel, Jesus wanted to emphasize the respect and proper worship due to the Father.

Salvation is a free gift God has offered to us. It is the victory that God accomplished, through the worthy offering of Jesus Christ, over the power of sin and death. This is the gift won for each of us and we are free to embrace it or reject it. When we receive the gift, we are called to live the life of a grateful recipient of grace. "If we move with the grace/gift we have received, then our hearts will, first of all, be filled with gratitude. Grateful hearts want to respond with love - to give thanks and praise, just as we say as we begin every Eucharistic Prayer: it is right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks."

When our hearts are absorbed in worldly concerns, we tend to move away from God or become disconnected. We need to do things (acts of penance) to help us "turn back" to our Lord, with all our heart. Therefore our Lenten acts of penance are a journey towards liberation from the bondage of selfishness and materialism - freedom to cooperate with and to respond to God's grace.

Let the Lenten "work" help us to discover where and in what concrete ways we are resisting and not cooperating with God's gifts. Let us discover what makes us. How do we respond to enticements that make me aggressive or desiring of what is not mine or what is not good for me), then I'm out of balance and I can be quite closed to the love God. Let us journey towards lent - to freedom and to God!

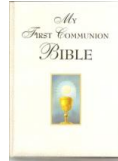
## Do you want to deepen your faith?

### 'I NEVER SAW ANOTHER BUTTERFLY:

**All are welcome to a Curtain Call/Child's Play Theatre ALL YOUTH production on Saturday, March 28<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at St. Patrick.** Play description: *Over 15,000 Jewish children passed through Terezin, Czech Republic, and only about a hundred were still alive when Terezin was liberated at the end of the war. One of the survivors, Raja, having lived through it all, teaching the children when there was nothing to teach with, helping to give them hope when there was little enough reason for hope, creating a little world of laughter, of flowers and butterflies behind the barbed wire, tells the true story of the children. It's her play and it's theirs. There were no butterflies at Terezin, of course, but for the children, butterflies became a symbol of defiance, making it possible for them to live on and play happily while waiting to be transported from this holding area to Auschwitz.*
