Increase our Faith.

A little girl told her father that her brother set traps to catch birds. He asked her what she did. She replied, "I prayed that the traps might not catch birds." Anything else? Yes, she said. "I prayed that God would keep the birds out of the traps." Anything else? Yes, then I went and kicked the traps all to pieces. The message Jesus drives home by answering the request of His disciples for more faith is that it is not the quantity of faith that is important, it is what we do with our faith, the quality of faith.

Jesus was asking them to do something. Back up one verse of today's Gospel and you will find this, "If your brother wrongs you seven times in one day and returns to you seven times saying I am sorry you should forgive him." They thought it was not possible at all. Immediately after that they said, "Lord, increase our faith." Jesus said, "If you have faith the size of a mustard seed...". What does that mean?

The disciples were thinking in terms of how much. Jesus was saying that size is not the issue. Amount has nothing to do with it. The important thing is what do we do with faith. Faith is not something we collect like rare coins. It is something we utilize like work tools. The Lord doesn't want a do-nothing faith. All he needs is a working kind of faith. If they believe, it would help them to forgive others. That is the real nature of faith—it gets things done.
