A Note From The Pastor



Every gift deserves a "Thank you." Today's readings focus on the obligation of giving thanks. They challenge us to awaken from our lethargy of ingratitude. They insist that we put aside our concentration on self in order to dwell on the goodness of others. Moreover, they demand a concrete recognition of such goodness. They proclaim that every gift requires a "Thank you." Gratitude, like charity, should begin at home. These biblical passages should prompt an awareness of other's kindness toward us, and gratitude based on that awareness. The love and concern of parents and other family members must be recognized for what they are, namely, great gifts for generous hearts. Instead of taking them for granted, we are urged to pause and reflect on our good fortune. In view of such awareness we are challenged to offer our thanks in return.

Our gratitude can take the form of imitation. Where we have received sympathy, support and concern, we can give sympathy, support and concern in return. In this way, the generosity of the giver is never lost. It takes flesh whenever we seek to recall that gift in a new situation.
