Dear Brothers and Sisters

This weekend we celebrate all Saints (Saturday) and all Souls (Sunday) day. We remember the lives of our dear departed brothers and sisters, not only to celebrate how they have made a difference of our lives but also to affirm a very important tenet of our faith. We believe that as faithful believers and followers of our Lord Jesus Christ, by virtue of our baptism, will inherit eternal life with our Father.

The scripture readings this weekend teach us a couple of hopeful ideas. While we might not be able to give recompense for all our sins here on earth, there is, by God's design and desire to save us, hope to be justified. IN our catholic teaching we call this "purgatory". It is a time for restitution. It is a state after death in which the souls of people who die are made pure through suffering before going to heaven.

WE have our purgatories here on earth. A form of sickness, an experience of pain, an unfortunate situation in life or loss of something or someone.
