## A Word from Father Victor ...



October 25, 2015

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

WE hear from scriptures this weekend the story of the blind Bartimeus being healed by Jesus. He knew who Jesus was calling him, "Son of David". He called out to him in a loud voice manifesting his earnest desire to be heard and to be healed. The blind man was very clear about what he wanted from Jesus: freedom from blindness.

Do we know who Jesus is? Do we have the same confidence and faith in Jesus as the blind man? What do we want from Jesus? Bartimeus, the blind beggar is a model for discipleship. He has faith in Jesus and was persistent and determined to get the attention of Jesus. His great desire and strong faith earned him his liberation from blindness and was able to "see"!

Upon being called by Jesus, Bartimeus, threw his cloak. The cloak means a lot for a beggar, it can be his sense of security. He threw away what little security he had in order to respond to the call of Jesus. Ironically this blind man knew what he was giving up for. Do we know what treasure we have in Jesus? What are we willing to give up to follow Jesus?

Three weeks ago we heard of the story of the rich young man. We can contrast Bartimeus to the rich young man. What does it tell us about our faith?

There is so much to be desired for in our faith journey. We have to realize that there is still so much to be done. Yet with the little things we are not willing to let go, how can we move forward with our faith?
