First Reading Psalm 110 1 Kings 17:17-24
"I will praise you, Lord,
for you have rescued me."

Second Reading Gospel:

Galatians 1:11-19 Luke 7:11-17

# From the Desk of the Pastor....



A French king is said to have stated, "The crown of France is worth a Mass a week." In reality, he cared little about religion, but since all France was Catholic, as king he had to go to church on Sunday. We could liken this to a modern teenager thinking, "The keys to the family car for my date are worth that Mass on Sunday."

There are various reasons why the faithful observe religious obligations. Some do it out of fear. One never knows what will happen to the other side of the grave, so they want to play safe. calculate like the Pharisees of Jesus' time, they are righteous people diligently observing the laws of their religion and they expect God to give them salvation in return. However, love and gratitude should be the principal motivation, not calculation and not certainly commercial fear, considerations. In the Promised Land, the Hebrews celebrated the Passover. motivation was not to get something. They offered their lambs as a sign of gratitude to God almighty. Eucharist in the New Testament reminds us of this. It is a memorial meal and it recalls to our minds all that Jesus did for us.

Eucharist is a sacrificial meal as it is a sacrifice of Jesus for the whole humanity. It is the culmination of His self-emptying. It is a thanksgiving meal as we remember and thank God for the abundance of blessings received. It is a meal of unity as it unites us with Christ and with one another. So, our Sunday Eucharist is not an obligation fulfilling spirituality, but a life giving spiritual experience. People come to Mass not to fulfill an obligation but because they need Jesus and because they need one another. They are there because they need Jesus and one another.

The celebration of the Eucharist implies serious challenges and obligations for Christians. First it implies a felt need to participate in the Eucharist as an expression of our gratitude to God. Second, it supplies a meaningful and fruitful celebration of the Eucharist. Third, participation is not an obligation that we fulfill, but our God-ward journey. Fourth, reminding one-self that a Eucharistic celebration is incomplete unless we try to live the celebration in life. Finally, willingness to make self-sacrifices by offering our gifts, time, talents, etc. for the benefit of the community.
