First Reading 2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13
Psalm 32 "I Lord, forgive the wrong I have done."
Second Reading Galatians 2:16, 19-21
Gospel: Luke 7:36 – 8:3

From the Desk of the Pastor....



"I can't believe he said that about me! I didn't want to work with someone that I can't trust, someone who is going to say one thing to my face and then do the exact opposite behind my back." Every one of us will have times when we are criticized, creating stress in our hearts and minds and tension in our relationships. Somebody at work or in our social circle speaks negatively about us or blowing some minor incident out of proportion.

Certainly, constructive criticism can be helpful. Sad to say, most criticism is not intended to build up another person, quite the opposite. Most criticism is based on jealousy. It stems from a competitive spirit. You have something that somebody else wants. Instead of being happy for you, instead of keeping a good attitude, jealousy rises up in the critical person. They try to cover their own insecurity by being critical.

Believe, not everybody will celebrate your victories with you. There are some positive ways to handle criticism. Never take it personally. Many times it is not even about you, even though it may be directed at you. He would be complaining about somebody else. Don't allow yourself to take revenge. Don't sink down to their level and start talking badly about them. Most of all, don't get defensive or try to prove that you are right and your critic is wrong. Keep your eyes on the prize, stay focused on your goals and do what you believe God wants you to do.

This is what Jesus told His disciples when he sent them out to various towns to preach the good news, to heal the sick and to care for them. He knew His followers would suffer rejection. Not everybody would like them or receive their message. So, he instructed His disciples, "When you go into a town and people will not welcome you there or receive your message, you leave that place, shake the dust off your feet." Jesus did not advise His disciples to become defensive or worried. He simply said, "Shake the dust off your feet." That was a symbolic way of saying, "You are not going to kill my spirit, you are not going to steal my joy. And I am not going to sink down to your level. I am not going to fight with you. I am going to let God be my vindicator." You will never win by sinking down to your critic's level by a counter attack. Rise above that. God will fight your battle for you.
