A Word from Father Victor ...

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

WE are always grateful to God who gives us the opportunity to grow in our relationship with him and teach us a more meaningful living. His lesson for us this weekend is about humility. There are so many ways to describe humility. From the gospel reading we will learn that humility is not much thinking “less” of ourselves but more thinking of ourselves “less”. I wonder that if we reflect on where you put the word “less” makes a difference.

IN humility we recognize our gifts. Our gifts are given to us not for what we have done but simply because of the generosity and love of the giver: God. He desires that we “humbly” use those gifts for the service of others, not just ourselves as a gesture of gratitude. That means sharing it without expecting anything in return or any entitlement. WE are invited to reflect: when we share something or serving someone, how are we humbled by our generosity or service?

Humble persons see themselves by reality and an honest assessment of one’s self. As James Kinn would say “humility equals realism”. IN looking at ourselves we truthfully relate ourselves to God, others and reality. Humble persons know exactly where they stand in relation to God and to others. Humble persons recognize their talents as gifts and are always grateful to the giver. IN response they share their gifts as an expression of gratitude.

Let us reflect on the generosity and humility of Jesus. Are we humble?
