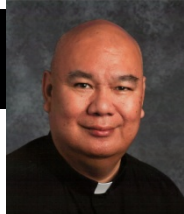
First Reading: Isaiah 58:7-10

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This week we celebrate Catholic Schools week at Most Holy Redeemer School. What significance is it to have a parish school? Most of the time the significance of a school is seen only on its financial impact to the parish. I invite you to think about what is the significance of a school to a parish?

Let us go back to the very essence of being a parish community. At the core of our mission is faith formation. It is our work as a church to make Christ known and strengthen our relationship with him and with one another. The kind of work that we do is formative. To make Christ known is both intellectual and relational. At a Catholic school, children are formed to become wholesome persons, intellectually competent, personally strong and morally and spiritually equipped. At a Catholic school we form students to integrate knowledge of science and faith in God. It helps them to embrace what they learn and appreciate the gifts of God. In our catholic schools, it is not only intellectual but also values formation. It is a formation of both the mind and the heart. This integral formation that is done at Most Holy Redeemer school is priceless. This work is a work of formation. The school makes a parish alive to its very essence: to make Christ known and to form strong and faithful believers of our Lord Jesus Christ.

To attain the beatitudes that Christ taught his disciples called for an intellectual and spiritual formation. To become wholesome and strong persons we must fill the mind intellectually and form the heart spiritually and morally.
